



Situate on the Frankstown branch of Juniata, in Frankstown Township Huntingdon County, Containing one hundred acres, forty seven perches and allowance of six per Cent & C. first surveyed the 2^d day of Decr 1766, in pursuance of an order of survey to Edward Woods, dated the first day of August 1766, No 19 and also surveyed the 24th day of Octbr 1803, in pursuance of a Warrant to John Wareham dated the 5th day of Sept 1803, it then contained 325^{a.3} 11^{p.3} and allowance & C. this part resurveyed and divided from the residue of said tract the 8th day of March 1821 The dotted lines representing the original survey of the said Edward Woods & John Wareham.
