



Situated in Hamilton Barr Township Adams County and surveyed May 1799  
in pursuance of a warrant for 40<sup>ac</sup> granted to William Waugh dated 21<sup>st</sup> March  
1785 By Moses McClean D. S.

on the afores<sup>d</sup> warrant Wm. Waugh claimed a parcel of land (for the use of the  
heirs of John Waugh) which was also claimed in part by Joseph Brown by  
warrant for 250<sup>ac</sup> dated 17<sup>th</sup>. April 1786, and also in part by the heirs of David  
Hart by warrant for 300<sup>ac</sup> dated September 16<sup>th</sup>. 1766. I transmitted the claims  
of the parties by actual survey to the General Surveyor and on a hearing of  
the parties before the Board Judgments in favour of Joseph Brown & David  
Harts, <sup>Heirs were Issued</sup> William Waugh commenced a suit in the Supreme Court—a verdict in  
favour of the heirs of David Hart was obtained but William Waugh obtained  
a verdict in his favour against Joseph Brown on which Joseph Brown rene-  
wed the action, but the parties finally settled the matter agreeable to the above  
survey
