



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July 1772 for Christopher Boistil on a Certain Lot of Ground Situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumb<sup>d</sup> marked in a General Plan of said Town Number One Hundred and Nine Contain<sup>g</sup> in Breadth East & West on the South side of Dewberry Street Sixty feet, and in Length North and South Two Hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Northward by Dewberry Street, Eastward by Fawn Street, Southward by Mulberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number One Hundred and Ten. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1776 for Jonas Weaver by Warrant dated the 23<sup>d</sup> of the same Month.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eighth day of July 1907.
