



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Upper Milford Township in the County of Northampton (formerly Bucks) and Province of Pennsylvania, Being Part of a Tract of 38^{ac} 142 Per etc. Allowance. That formerly was Surveyed to John Koocken in Pursuance of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries granted to John Miller, dated the 18th May 1750. Who Sold and Assigned his Right to the Same on the back of the said Warrant unto the Said John Koocken, who Sold and Conveyed his Right to the Same to his Son Henry Koocken, by Agreement of the 4th Septemb: 1761. who again Sold and Assigned the Same to Christian Miller on the 22^d January, 1785. Who also Now Sold and Conveyed the above unto Martin Werffel by Agreement of the 19th Nov: 1768. Beginning at a black Oak in a Line of Land, belonging to Jacob Kamers Heirs. Thence by the Same and by Land of Peter Shlosser, West 76 perches to a Black Oak (blown down) a Corner of Andrew Engelmans Land, Thence by the Same North 26³/₄ perches to a Stone Set for a Corner of Anthony Stiehler's Land, Thence by the Same and by Land of John Shout, East 76 perches to a Stone Thence by the said John Shout's other Land South 26³/₄ perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Twelve Acres of Land together with the usual Allowance at Six per Cent for Roads. Surveyed for the said Martin Werffel on the 2^d November Anno 1768.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eighth day of July 1907.
