



Draft of a tract of unimproved land Situate in the township of Falls in Luzerne County, adjoining lands of John Asterhaut and others on the waters of Buttermilk Falls creek. Containing fifty two acres, one hundred forty seven perches of land besides the usual allowance of Six per centum for roads &c. Surveyed the above described tract of land the thirtieth day of May 1837 for James Weed by virtue of his warrant dated the fourteenth day of April 1837. Zebulon H. Stevens D.S.

To John Taylor Esq. Surveyor General. William Oliphant & Robert Lusk were surveyed and returned about the year 1774. Robert Lusk was patented some fifteen or twenty years ago on a County Treas^r deed & sale for taxes. No person it appears has claimed the W^m Oliphant tract under the Warrantee. It has been seated by Joseph Post, who has heretofore claimed to the dotted line, near thirty years. Joseph Post & Daniel Post claim under a deed from Thomas Overton of 1805 & 1809. Stephen Post's warrant for the above land & to include his imp^t is dated the 29th day of April 1837. Zebulon H. Stevens D.S.
