



In pursuance of an actual Settlement commenced about  
 the year 1820 by Wm D. Sandborn Joseph King, now deceased, (who left the West  
 half of the tract to Sarah his widow, afterwards Sarah Taylor,) was  
 surveyed on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March 1839 the above described undrawn  
 Donation tract N<sup>o</sup> 1437 in the 7<sup>th</sup> District, the North West 6.9 acres  
 6 perches for Chancellor K. Bailey, the East half 113 acres 4 perches  
 for George Miles, and the South East part of the West half 43  
 acres 166 perches for Thomas Hamilton — the whole tract containing  
 226 acres and 7 perches and allowance of Six per cent for roads  
 &c. Situate in Richmond township, Crawford county.
