In Persuance of a Warrant of eight acres of Land Granted to James Lowry dated the twenty third day of March A.D. 1805 was Surveyed the twenty seventh day of August A.D. 1828 the above described piece of Land— Containing seven acres and eighty four perches and allowance of six per Cent. for Roads &c. Situate opposite the west end of Walnut Street in the Borough of Meadville, Mead Township Crawford County, Pennsylvania. the same was a low point of land in a bend of French Creek, and after it was improved by said Lowry, said Creek cut a chanel through, and is at this time an Island.
