The dotted lines are part of a draught of a tract of Land surveyed for Benj<sup>m</sup> Elliott on Warrant dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1763. This tract interferes seventy seven acres and one Hundred and forty five perches with the William Perry Survey. Benjamin Elliott Conveyed to John Ramsey, who devised the same to his heirs the present owners John Ramsey also purchased from William Perry —
