It appears by a certificate bearing date the 23rd June 1768 and signed James Tilghman Secretary that by agreement between Doctor William Smith (who claimed the Land surveyed on Application entered in the name of William Brown) ~~and~~ and the above named Samuel Finley that Thirty-eight acres of the above described land should ^{be} cut off which Certificate is ~~attached~~ remain^g attached to the original Survey made in the name of W^m Brown and said Comp^t has since (as it is alledged) been included in a Pat^t to Jacob Wilson therefore no ^{future}

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this tenth day of August 1907
