



A Draft of a part of a tract of land situate in Letterkenny Township Franklin County (formerly Cumberland County) containing Twenty seven acres thirty four perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. which was surveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1822 for Jacob Killinger by William S. Davis Esq<sup>r</sup> then Deputy Surveyor Being part of a larger tract of 87<sup>as</sup> 158<sup>ps</sup> & allowance of six per Cent for roads &c. which was surveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 1763, in pursuance of a warrant granted Henry Jones dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of November 1762. Examined the above survey and find it to be correct.

Certified the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March 1827.
