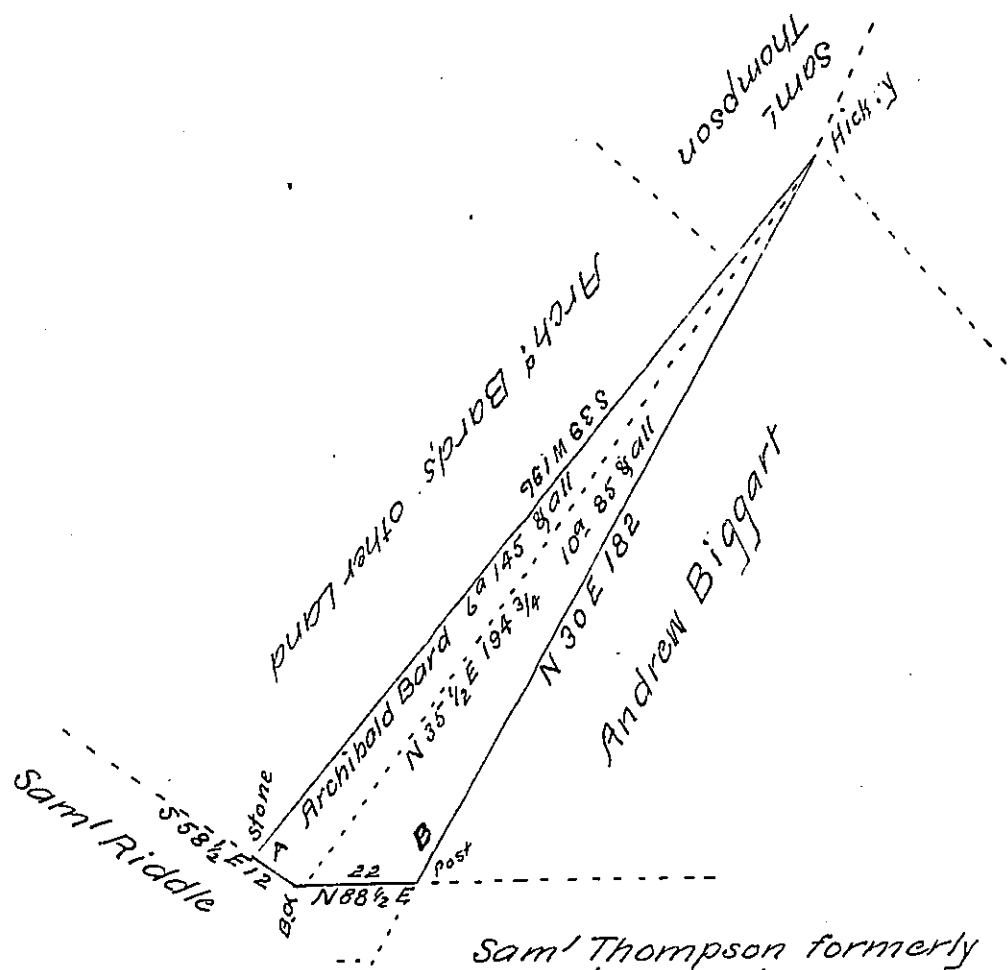

N. B. The part B. Containing 10^{as} 85 1/2 & allowance is Claimed by Andrew
Briggart as part of a survey made for him On a Warrant Dated 17th
Dec 1774 He states that the Closing line was not run at the time of Making the
Survey But was left open from the Hickory to the Black Oak - Mr Bard States
that He called on Mr Biggart to have the line Closed (Thomas Poe Esq^r D.S.
being along to run it) and that Mr Biggart Shewed Him the Post twenty two
perches East of the B.O. as his upper corner, from which Thomas Poe Esq^r D.S run
a Strait Course to the Hickory - Since Making the above Survey I have run Mr
Biggarts line from the B.O. to his Corner post adjoining David Cashler and
find that it measures Sixty two and an half perches, Old Survey calls for thirty
four and an half perches - - - - - Arch^d Fleming D.S

I do Certify that at the time of Making the above Survey there was a House
thereon, and part of the land Cleared and Cultivated, and a Family res-
iding thereon Given under my hand this 22nd of March 1815
