



The above described Tract of Land situate in Letterkenny Township Franklin County, Containing sixteen Acres and fifty perches and the allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c. was Surveyed the 23<sup>d</sup> day of August 1804 (by Thomas Kirby Esq<sup>r</sup>. the then Deputy Surveyor) in pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Henry Davis (for 25 Acres) bearing date the 30<sup>th</sup> day of July 1804, as appears by the Official Survey thereof remaining in my Office this 9<sup>th</sup> day of August 1822,
