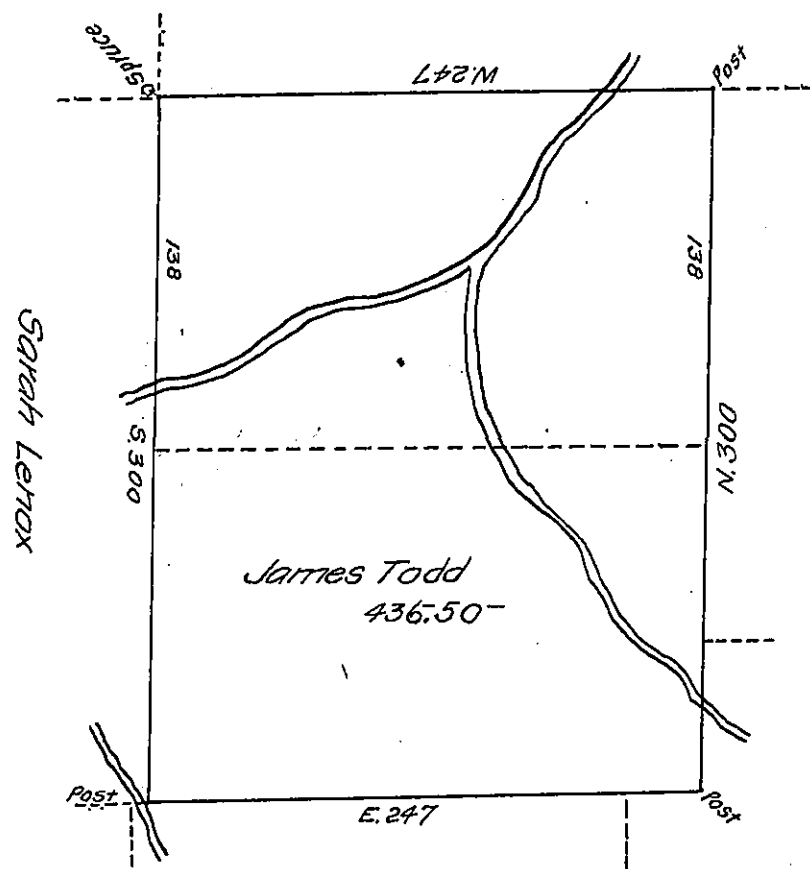

 10<sup>th</sup> day of November 1793 unto James Todd the above described Tract of  
 Four hundred and thirty-six Acres and 50 perch<sup>s</sup> of Land and allow<sup>n</sup> Situated  
 on Mahopeny about eight or ten Miles from the Mouth thereof in Luzerne County

Note, the land to the North of the pricked line is claimed by Edward  
 C-137-130 Miller on a Warrant dated 28<sup>th</sup> of April 1775 and said to have been <sup>early</sup> surv<sup>d</sup> but of this
