



The above tract or piece of land, containing One hundred fifty two acres, one hundred forty one perches and allowance of six per cent. &c. &c. is situated adjoining John Rice and others in Blakely township Luzerne County. There is a log-cabin upon the tract, and a small piece of cleared land about it, perhaps half an acre. The cabin is not inhabited, there being no roof on it. And it does not appear to have been for several years. The cleared land has not the appearance of ever having been cultivated. In pursuance of a Warrant issued to Agnes Weaver July 29<sup>th</sup> 1857. Surveyed the above land March 2<sup>d</sup> 1858. And from the best information it appears to be a part of two tracts previously surveyed on Warrants to Prudence and Mary Dilly.
