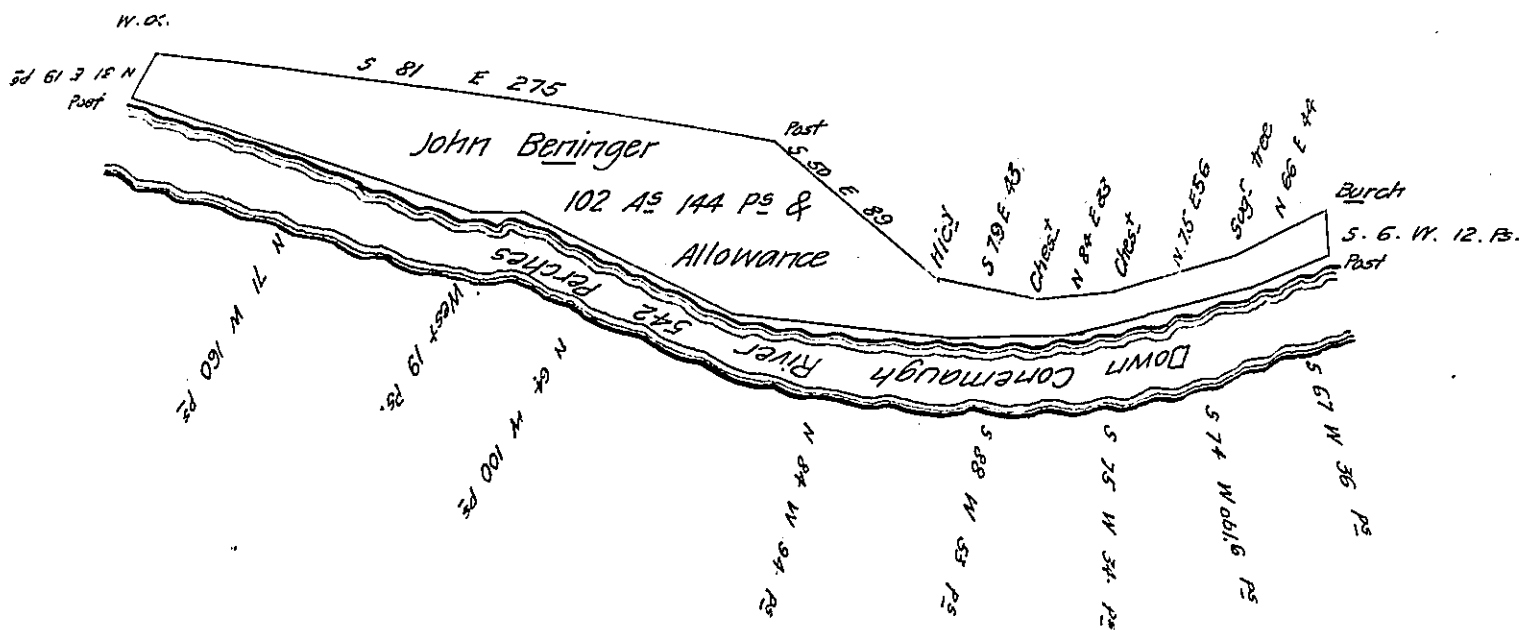


Vacant Hills



Surveyed to John Ben<sup>r</sup>inger on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January 1815 the above described tract of land containing one hundred and two acres and one hundred and forty four perches and Allowance of six p<sup>c</sup> Cent situate on the North side of the Cornemough River opposite to where Doc<sup>t</sup>. Marchand is boring for salt in the Gap where the Cornemough—passes through the Chesnut Ridge in Wheatfield Township Indiana County by Warrant of the 18<sup>th</sup> July 1814
