



SITUATE in Hemlock Township in the County of North-
umberland Surveyed on the 9 day of January 1808 -

The Yellow lines Represents a Survey made for Hugh-
McWilliams in the year 1774 Containing two hundred
and twenty nine acres and six perches & allowance -

The Red lines a survey made on the 9 day of Janu-
ary 1808 for John Foust by Virtue of his Warrant bear-
ing date on the 23 day of December 1807 Containing one
Hundred and thirty seven acres and fifty nine Perch-
es with the usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent &c.

The Tract Containing 50^{as}. 87 perches is claimed by a
Congregation of Germans who have a church on it -

The Tract Containing 41 acres & 30 perches is claim-
ed by a German Minister by the name of William
Inkott. I send this to shew the situation of the land.
