



The above draft describes a piece of land in Tyrone Township containing 7 acres 36 perches & allowance. Survey'd the 19th Nov A. Do. 1823 in pursuance of a warrant for three acres dated the 9th of August 1821 granted to John Bear. Pr. G. Monroe D. S.

Francis Gibson Esq. caveats the above warrant and survey on the ground that the land is not described by said warrant, and claims said land by his more descriptive warrant for 17as dated the 12th of May 1823. G. M. —

This warrant ^{of Bear} first executed being the oldest. Tho both were laid the same day. G. M. —

Note. The above point of 27 rod-thrown off being clear land, which will leave the content of 7 acres. and allowce. and will shorten the upper line to 119 ps. and the lower line to 132 and 5 tenths as marked within the above draft. G. Monroe. —
