



*By Virtue* of a Warrant from the Proprietaries of Pennsylvania Granted to Joseph Richardson and Jacob Leech bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1763. The above described small Piece of Land was Surveyed unto Isaac Williams Situate in Crasher Township in the County of Chester Beginning at a black Oak corner of John Griffith late William Hudson's Land Thence by other Land of the said Isaac Williams South Sixty five Degrees West four perches & an half perches to a Spanish Oak and North Twenty four Degrees & thirty Minutes West one hundred & thirteen pches to a Post Thence by the Land of Thomas White South twenty seven Degrees East One hundred and Thirteen pches to the place of Beginning Containing One Acre & an half ~~Acres~~ of land beside the Usual Allowance of Six Acres ~~per~~ Cent. Being part of the unlocated Land Ordered by the Tenor of the said recited Warrant to be Surveyed and laid out unto the above Named Joseph Richardson & Jacob Leech The said Isaac Williams having now produced Sundry Conveyances whereby he appears to be intitled to the said Quantity of one Acre & an half thereof Surveyed the 7<sup>th</sup> 3mo. 1765. ~~at~~ Thoma Lightfoot D.S.
