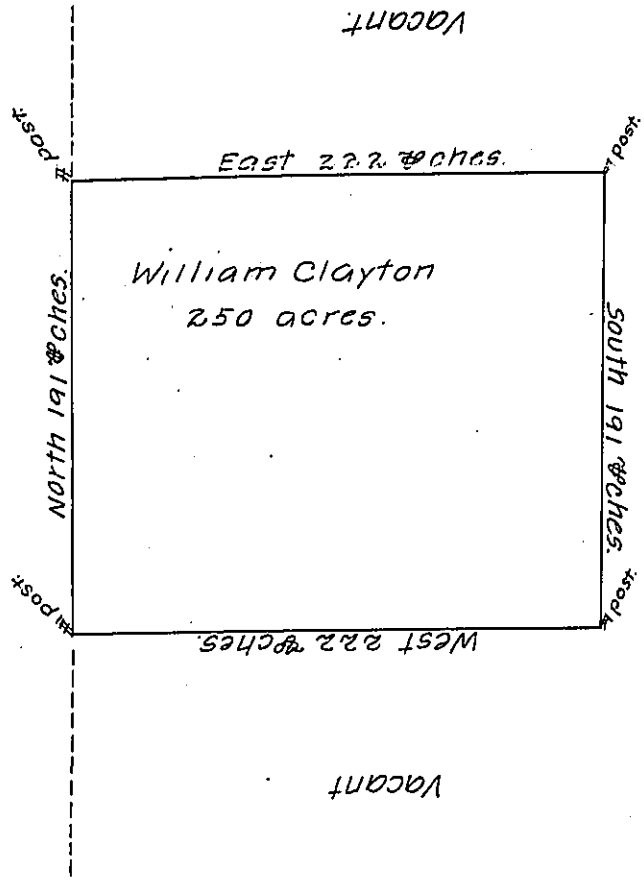

William Clayton's Land Situate on a Branch of Octararo Creek in the County of Chester. Begins at a post in the Line of Philip Howell's Land thence East by Vacant land two hundred twenty two ches to a post thence South by Vacant land one Hundred Ninety one ches to a post thence west by vacant Land two hundred twenty two ches to a post thence North by the Land of the sd Philip Howell one hundred Ninety one ches to the place of Begining Containing two Hundred & fifty acres and the allowance of six acres 1/2 Cent.

Two hundred twenty five acres of the above Described tract of Land were Surveyed the 28th of 8br 1714 to Wm Clayton pursuant to a Warrt Granted by the Comiss^{rs} of Property to Sarah Green by her assigned to the sd William and the other twenty five acres were Layd out to the sd Wm Clayton on the Nineteenth day of October 1718 by Order of the Comiss^{rs} afo^{re}
