



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Proprietarys Commissioners dated the 13th of the 11th moth. 170³/₄ There was survey'd to Joseph Cloud on the 12th day of May 1704 a Certain Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Cain in the County of Chester containing One hundred acres (fifty thereof in Right of Richard Farr and Fifty in right of Mary Farr - his wife being their proportion of head land.) Beginning at a Black Oak being a corner of other Land of the s^d. Joseph Cloud thence South 87^d. west by the same Land 376 ~~per~~ ches to a White Oak by the West branch of Brandiwine then Down the same south 68^d. East 60 ~~per~~ ches South 77^d.
