Whereas = there is a tract of Land within the proprietaries Mannor of Rockland adjoining to a Plantation formerly Possessed by John Grubb in the county of Newcastle, whole Descendents. ——— understanding the s^d tract of Land would be Disposed of by the Proprietaries they the s^d Descendents joyntly applied themselves several years ago to y^e Late Commissioners of Property Requesting they might be admitted to Purchase the same each of them Desiring a part thereof to Enlarge the small quantity Each of them Respatively had bequea^{thed} him by his fathers will which Request being favored by the s^d Commissioners, tho no Confirmation could^{then} be had thereof, yet their Request was by the s^d commissioners as then understood ordered to be Entered in the s^d comm^{es} minates, therefore, we, Sam^l Grubb, Peter Grubb ——— some of the s^d J. Grs. Descend^{ts} still contin^g the same Request Do Enter this as a Caveat in the survey^r Genarall^s office that no return be made of the s^d Land into the Secretary's office for other Parsons untill they have a full and fair hereing before the Proprietors about the same
