Hollingsworth to George Robinson for 250<sup>as</sup> being the rem<sup>t</sup> of the Original ~~of~~ purchase of John Tovey. But now appears <sup>within</sup> ye Antient lines & bounds to contain 305<sup>as</sup>. The overplus ye Widow of Stephen Harlan, des<sup>ires</sup> to purchase for her child. I have therefore advised <sup>her</sup> to apply to thee, who most Certainly must be better acquainted with those affairs than any other p<sup>erson</sup>, w<sup>ts</sup>soever and always ready to serve an honest Widow.
