



A draught of a tract of land situate in Potters township in Centre County containing two hundred and five acres & 155 perches & the usual allow<sup>ce</sup> of six  $\frac{7}{8}$  Cent for roads & c<sup>a</sup> which from a draft remaining in my Office appears to have been surveyed Aug. 18<sup>th</sup> 1790. for John Hastings by virtue of his Warrant dated December 26<sup>th</sup> 1787 examined & c<sup>a</sup> Oct<sup>r</sup>. 30<sup>th</sup> 1808.

Note this survey appears to be altogether included in that of Henry Berkey made Oct<sup>r</sup>. 1775 on W<sup>t</sup> of Dec<sup>r</sup>. 5<sup>th</sup> 1774.
