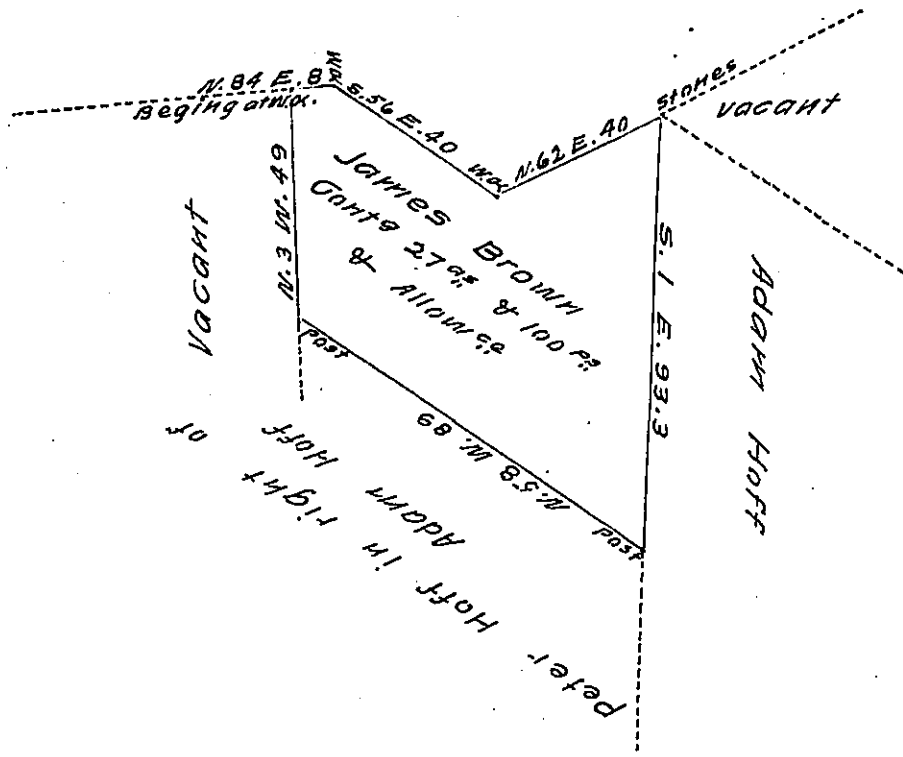

Originally surveyed by Charles Lukens late D. S. on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1767. In pursuance of a Warrant for 25<sup>ac</sup> granted to James Brown bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1750 - Resurveyed by the old lines on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 1803 by John Eichelberger late D. S.

And now on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January 1813 the same has been calculated examined and found to be correct and at the request of Peter Hoff the same is returned for confirmation.
