



In pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1785 entitled an Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised the troops by this Commonwealth, and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the honorable the Executive Council I have surveyed on tenth day of December 1785 the above described tract of two hundred acres of lands, and allowance for roads &c. No. 401 situate in district No. 2 on the west side of the Alleghany river in the county of Westmoreland
