



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the Mode of Distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Common-wealth" and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council I have Survey'd on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1785 the above described tract of two hundred Acres of Land & Allow<sup>ce</sup> of six Pct for Roads &c. No DCCLXI situate in District No 4 on the west side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
