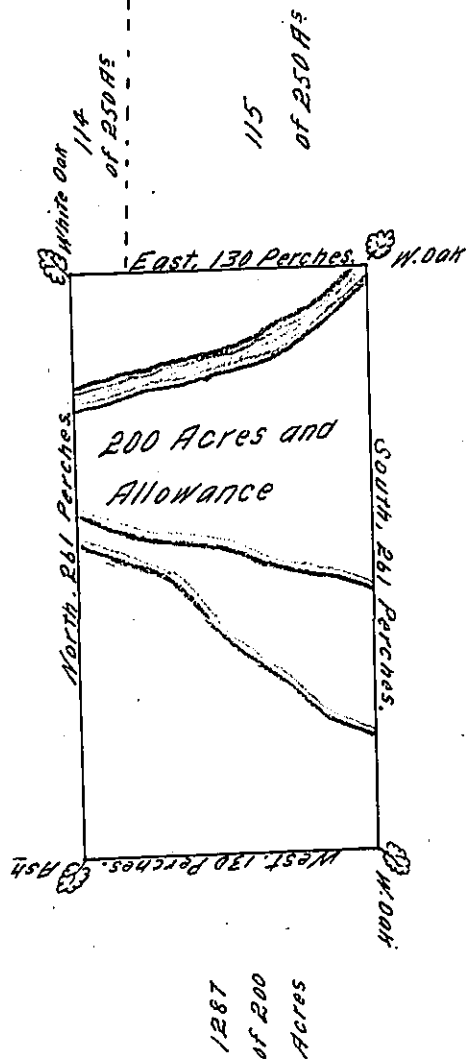


Donation - Land, in District No. 6.

A Patent was issued to John Lawson of the
 Coy of Philad^a Mariner dated the 31st day of November
 1795 ~~ix xxxvii~~ for this Tract of Land in right of John
 Shaw private whose right to a Tract of land cont^d
 200 acres found to lie in New York became vested

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly
 of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of Feb-
 ruary 1785, intitled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing
 the Donation-Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth',
 and by Order of the Surveyor-General, with the Approbation of the
 Honourable the Executive-Council, I have surveyed, on the Twenty
 ninth Day of November 1785, the above described Tract of Two Hund-
 red Acres of Land, and Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads, &c. No.
 1294 situate in District No. 6, on the West Side of the Allegheny
 River, in the County of Westmoreland.
