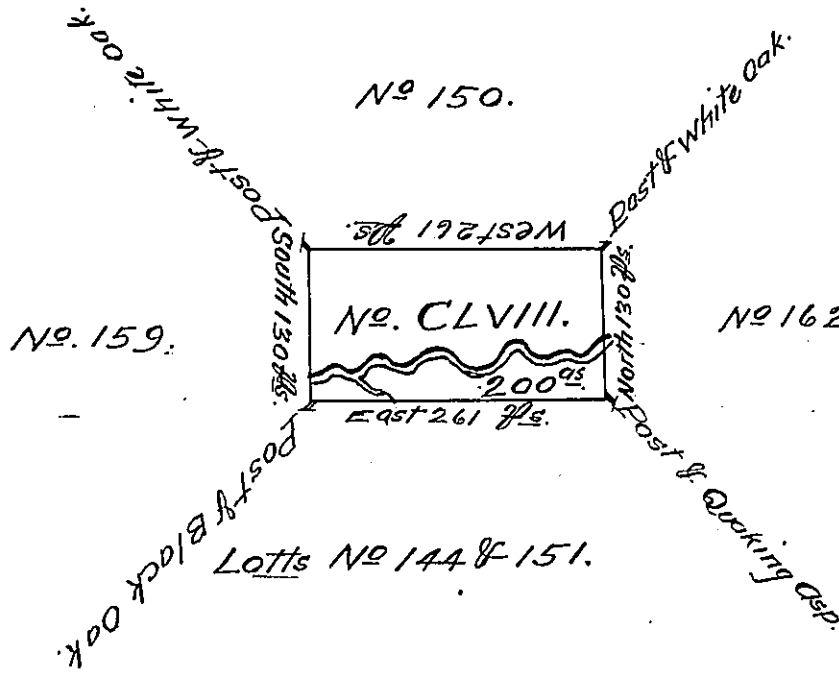


Received of James Trimble a

In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State  
 of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785, en-  
 titled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the dona-  
 tion lands promised the Troops of this commonwealth; and by  
 order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the  
 Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I have surveyed  
 on the Fifth day of <sup>November</sup> ~~October~~ 1785, the above described Tract  
 of Two Hundred acres of Land, and allowance of six per  
 cent. for roads, &c. No. CLVIII. situate in District No 1. -  
 on the west side of the Allegany river, in the county of  
 Westmoreland.
