



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1785, entitled "An Act for directing the mode of Distributing - the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Common-wealth, and by Order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of The Hon<sup>ble</sup>. The Supreme Executive Council I have surveyed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1785 the above discribed Tract of Two Hundred acres of land and allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent. for Roads &c. No. LIII. Situate in district No. 1. On the west side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
