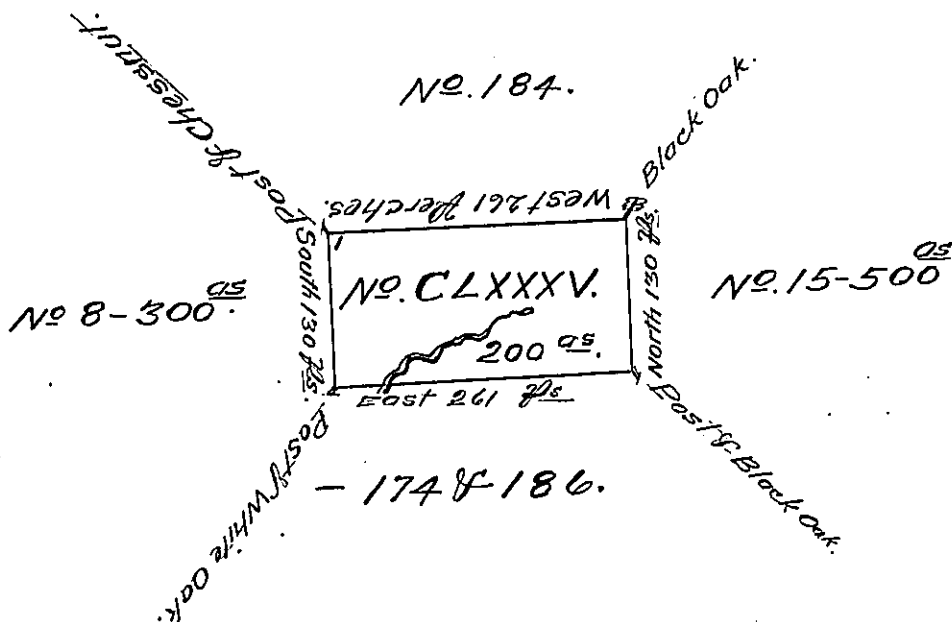


Patent to Jacob Stroud  
Assignee of Josiah Thomas  
Private of Rangers  
June 19<sup>th</sup> 1794.



Received of James Trimble a Patent  
dated the 19<sup>th</sup> of June 1794 to Jacob Stroud as  
assignee of Josiah Thomas Private of Rangers.  
Dan. Stroud.

In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the  
State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785,  
entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the  
donation lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth;  
and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation  
of the Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I  
have surveyed on the Eighth day of <sup>November</sup> ~~October~~ 1785, the  
above described Tract of Two Hundred acres of Land,  
and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. No. CLXXXV.  
situate in District No. 1, on the west side of the Allegany  
river, in the county of Westmoreland.
