And se wells Consents & allows that if Jne Taylor can prove that he ever made
any Survey on the se Land for himself before 7 ber. last then he will contentedly resign his Claim to the Land so proved to be Surveyed to the se Ine Taylor
Ine Well's Warrt for 600? dated the 9th of Jany. 1733.
