



Isaac Taylor's Land situate on a branch of Octararoe creek in the Township of Sadbury in the County of Chester part of one thousand acres granted to him by the Comiss^{rs} Warr^t dated the 23^d day of March 1713/4.

Begins at a corner marked Chesnut Tree being a corner of Caleb Pusey's Land thence South by the said Pusey's Land 180 pches to a post thence west by Vacant Land 283 pches to a Hickory thence North by Vacant Land 180 pches to a post thence East by Vacant Land 283 pches to the place of Beginning Containing three Hundred acres, and the Allowance of Six acres 1/2 Cent.

Survey'd the 27th day of March 1714.
