In pursuance of an Act of Assembly passed the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March 1783 for the sale of certain lands therein mentioned & by virtue of a Commission under the hand and seal of Office of John Lukens Esq<sup>r</sup> Surveyor General for the state of Penn<sup>a</sup> to me directed bearing date the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1783 the Above tract of land containing ~~two Hundred~~ Two hundred and forty four acres and fifty four perches And Allowance of 6 P. Cent for roads &c<sup>a</sup> was Surveyed on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of June 1785 by
