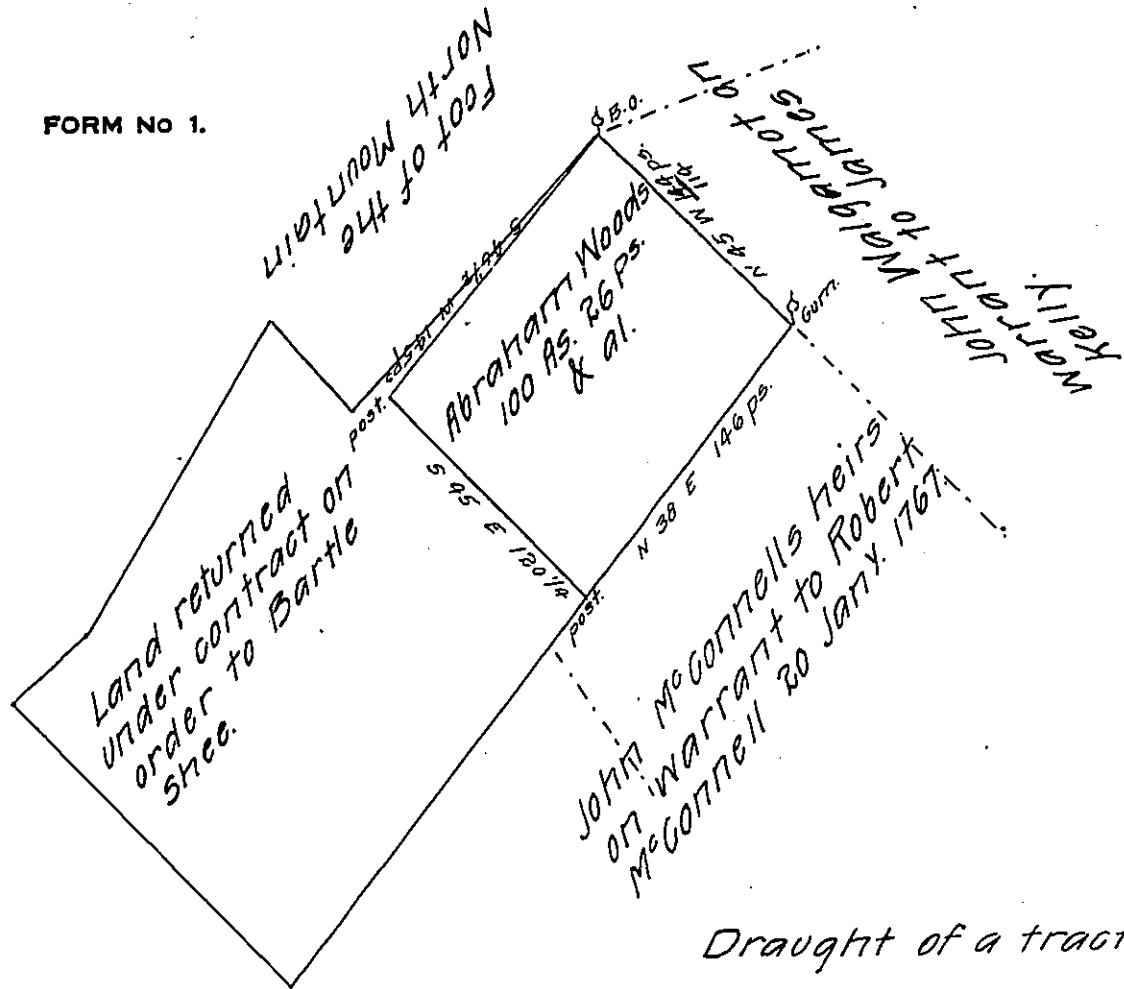


FORM No 1.



Draught of a tract of land situate in Letterkenny township Franklin County, containing one hundred acres, twenty six perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed 7th October 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c. And by virtue of an order of survey dated 31st of October 1766. No 1756 granted Abraham Woods for 100 acres "in Letterkenny township bounded by Robert McConnell on the east and the North Mountain on the North West."

Report The above tract is included within the lines of a larger tract of 302^a. 133 Ps. & all^e Surveyed 2nd June 1786 on warrant to And^{rs} Boggs for 300 As. dated 23^d August 1789, and returned on dispute with Robert James & John McConnell; who claimed the land by virtue of their warrant dated 17 January 1785- decision of the Board of Property not ascertained. The blank lines represent the balance of survey on Boggs warrant. Note. No evidence of Woods' order being executed on the land. John McConnells heirs owners. John McConnell occupier. Wm. S. Davis.
