



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled an Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Common Wealth; and by order of the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council; I have surveyed on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September 1785 The above discribed Tract of two Hundred Acres of Land & Allowance of Six per Cent. for Roads &c. N° DCCCXCV. Situate in District N° 5 on the west side of the Allegheny River in Westmoreland County.
