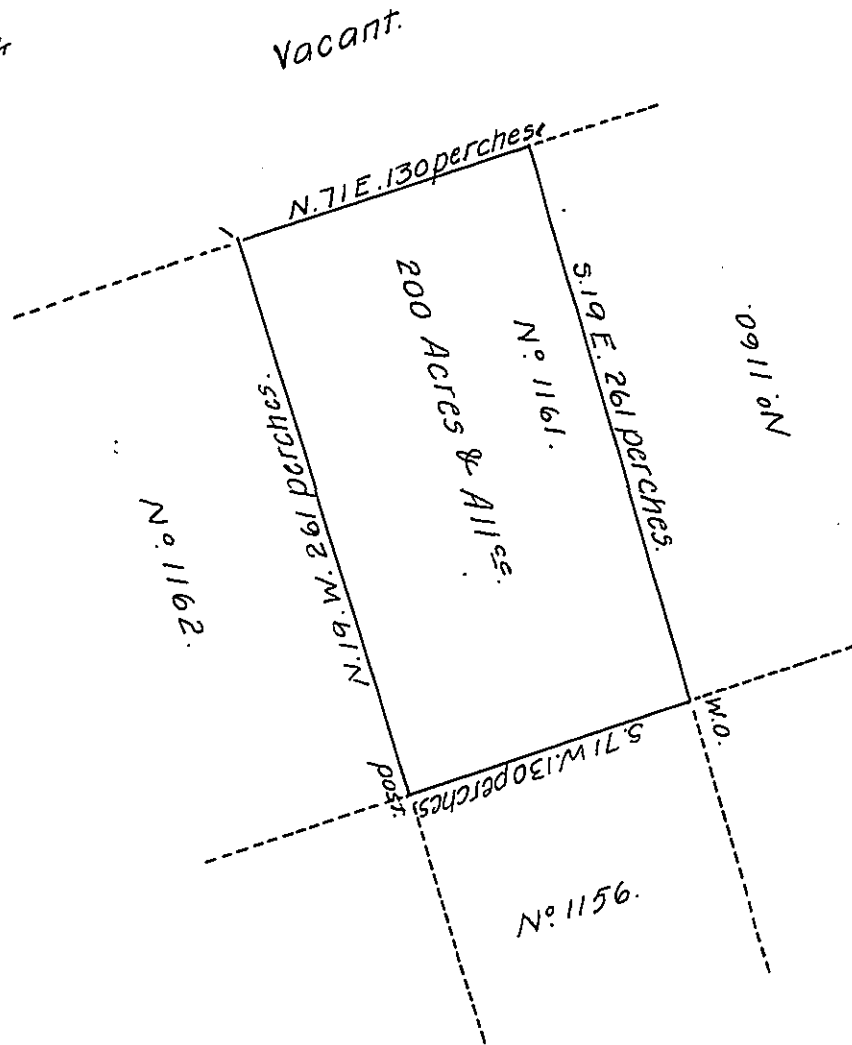

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24th Day of February 1785, intituled an "Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation lands promised to the troops of this Commonwealth and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 16th Day of November 1785 the above described tract of two hundred Acres of land and Allowance of six ~~per~~ Cent. for Roads &c. No 1161, situate in District No 6 on the west side of the Allegheny River in the County of Westmoreland.
