



In pursuance of an act of General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled "An act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised to the troops of this Commonwealth;" And by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Executive Council I have surveyed on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1785 the above described tract of five hundred Acres and allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Ct for roads &c Nº CLXXXI situate in district Nº 10 on the west side of Allegheny river in the County of Westmoreland.
