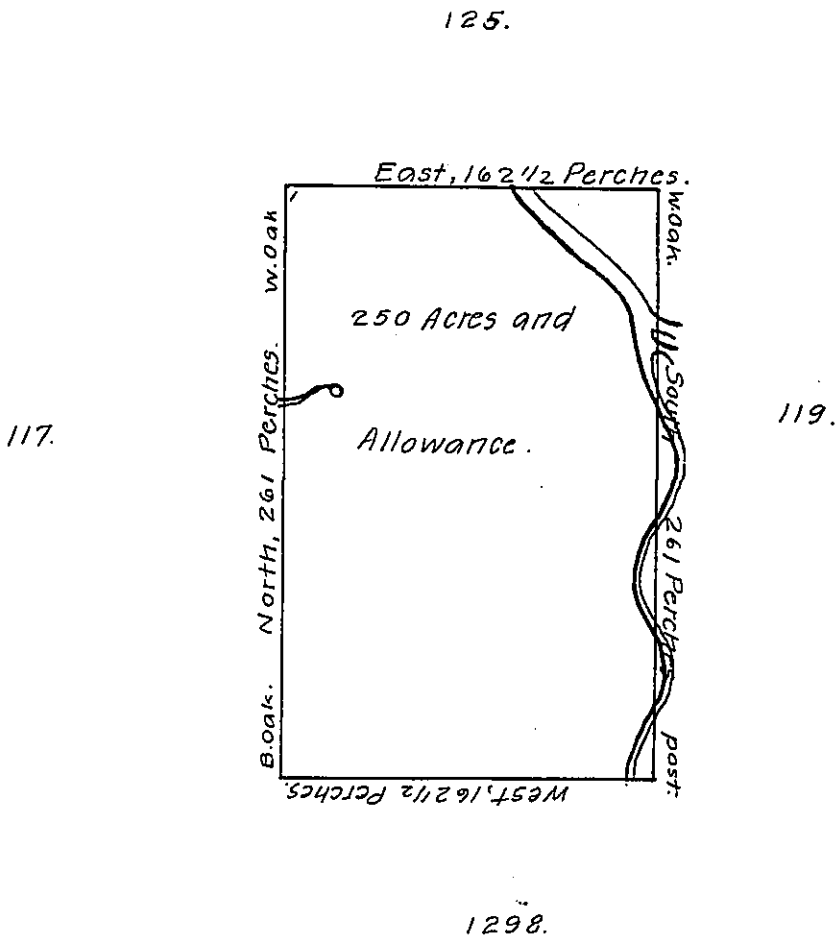


Donation-Land, in District No. 6.

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of February 1785, intitled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation-Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth; and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the Honourable the Executive-Council, I have surveyed, on the Sixth Day of December 1785, the above described Tract of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land, and Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c, No 118 situate in District No. 6, on the West side of the Allegheny River, in the County of Westmoreland.
