



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, Passed the 24th day of February 1785, entitled An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth, and by order of the Surveyor Gen^l. with the approbation of the Hon^{ble} the Supreme Executive Council I have surveyed on the 6th day of October 1785, the above described Tract of Two Hundred and Fifty acres of land and allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. for Roads &c. No IV. situate in district No. 1, on the west side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
