



Draught of a tract of land situate in  
 Fannet Township in the County of Franklin  
 Containing within the above lines 98 acres 156  
 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads  
 & surveyed 24 Oct<sup>r</sup> 1829 in pursuance of a  
 Contract with the Board of Property for  
 carrying into effect the Several Acts of Assem-  
 bly relating to unpatented Lands under Proprietary  
 Rights &c. And by virtue of an Order of Survey dated  
 19<sup>th</sup> March 1767 N<sup>o</sup> 3099 granted to Joseph Spear for 150  
 Acres "Bought of Richard Coulter in Path Valley bounded  
 by John Burns and Hugh Herran including his Imp<sup>t</sup>  
 made 3 years ago."

Report - The above tract is covered in part by a survey of 417 a 117 pr on a warrant to  
 Mary Gray dated 7<sup>th</sup> March 1794 - Also covered in part by a survey of 409 a 100 pr  
 on a Warrant to David Ross dated 7 March 1794 - The dotted lined figures  
 represent the boundaries of last mentioned two surveys. Note - See Warrant to Jere-  
 miah Houghinberry for 300 Acres dated 1<sup>st</sup> Feb<sup>r</sup> 1796 said to be for the above Land,  
 but no survey found made thereon. The above survey is rather superficial; not being able  
 to ascertain the boundary of the present holder of the Land; who claims under an Imp<sup>t</sup>  
 right. The lines being only extended so as to cover the Improvement - The owner refusing to  
 accompany the Survey or produce papers - No evidence appears of a Survey on - Spears  
 Order; but the Land recognized as his in the year 1769. Note. The Owner claims 150 Acres  
 of Land in this place W. S. Davis  
 John Johnston Owner Widow Houghinberry Occupier.
