No 1. represented by dotted lines is part of a survey made for Thomas Coleman  
 on Warrant dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> day - March 1787 - This Survey interferes Sixty one  
 acres and one hundred and twenty four perches with the Thomas Mayberry  
 tract. Thomas Coleman is the present owner

No 2. represents part of a survey made for James Farrel on Warrant dated  
 the 15<sup>th</sup> day - November 1787. This Survey interferes one hundred and twenty  
 acres and one hundred and fifty seven perches with the Thomas Mayberry  
 tract - James Farrel Conveyed to Edward Hodges - who conveyed to George  
 Fetters - who devised the same to his heirs - who conveyed to Daniel Mc  
 Calla. John Cough John McCormack and Robert Hambleton the present  
 Owners.
