



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 8th day of May 1828. Surveyed the above described tract of six hundred and eight acres & allows. of six percent. about eight miles up Blacklick (Black legs) Creek from Black legs town at the mouth of a run which empties into the West side of said Creek situate in Conemaugh Township in the County of Indiana. By virtue of a location granted to Phillip & Robert McGuire the 3^d of April 1769 N^o 1680
