



In pursuance of an Application granted to Thomas Seaton N<sup>o</sup> 2365 dated 3<sup>o</sup> of April 1769 Surveyed on the 19<sup>th</sup> of January 1829 the above described tract of land Containing three hundred and forty five acres and thirty eight perches and the allowance proportioned at Six per Cent. for Roads &c. Situate on the <sup>South</sup> west side of Loyalhanna westward from Ligonier in Ligonier Township Westmoreland County Pa. S. L. Carpenter D.S.

Note.) The above survey was made on this ground in order to join James Hill who once lived on the bank of Loyalhanna and the only one that had been about there at an early day though it is not four mile from fort Ligonier — but this was perhaps owing to the regulations of the Military who would not permit any Location to be held nearer than three miles of the fort and the Applicant would describe it incorrectly in order to get it granted in defiance of — these laws.
