



In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest ^{due} to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other Office Titles issued from, or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the board of Property I have this 20th day of February 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of land containing two hundred and ninety two acres and allowance of six per Cent on Blacklick Creek to the left hand of the old Indian path leading from Ligonier to Kittanning adjoining lands of William Brown Richard Shannon Moses Stewart & others - Situate in Blacklick Township Indiana County - By virtue of a Location granted to George Brown on the 3^d of April 1769 No. 2390.
