



In pursuance of and Application granted to John Burd No. 1054, dated 3d. of April 1769, Surveyed on the 13th of March 1829, the above described tract of land containing four hundred and seventy one acres and one hundred ^{twenty perches.} and the allowance proportioned at six per cent for Roads &c. Situate on the Allegheny Trading path (alias) Kittanning including Barr's fort otherwise Geo. Armstrong's redoubt in Derry Township, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.
