



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by the authority of the board of property, I have this 22<sup>d</sup> day of February 1828 ~~the above~~ surveyed the above described tract of three hundred and five acres and a half and allowance of Six per Cent on the north side of Conemaugh river joining the Kittanning path & about 1/2 mile from the river on the left hand a free stone spring adjoining lands of James Campbell, Thomas Jamison & others situate in Blacklick Township Indiana County by virtue of a location granted to Samuel Culbertson Jr. the 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769, No. 1002.

That part of the above survey represented by the dotted line including the letter A was surveyed to James Campbell the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1773 by warrant of the 27<sup>th</sup> day of February 1773. C. was Surveyed to James Campbell the 26 Novr 1767 by warrants of the 18-March & 5-Dece. 1786 and that including the letter D was surveyed to William Beard the 1-May 1786 by wart of the 13<sup>th</sup> February 1786.
