



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by the authority of the board of property I have this 15th day of February 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of two hundred and ninety seven acres and allowance of six per cent adjoining lands of Thomas Taylor, Samuel Dickson Joseph Dickson and others situate at Blacklick on Blacklick creek in Blacklick township in the county of Indiana. By virtue of an order granted to Jeremiah Warden Junr the 3d day of April 1769. No. 1093.
