



Situate in Augusta Township Northumberland County, Surveyed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1835 by Virtue of an Apl. dated the 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 710 granted to Thomas Craike. Containing Three hundred and twenty one acres & a half with the usual allowance of Six Per Cent &c.

Note, the same tract of land was Surveyed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1769 for said Tho<sup>s</sup> Craike. And on the 23<sup>rd</sup> August 1769 the same tract of land <sup>was</sup> Surveyed to John Kerlin. And on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup>. 1788 it was Resurveyed for John Kerlin by Virtue of his order dated 3<sup>rd</sup> Ap<sup>r</sup>. 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 1130 agreeable to the dotted lines as marked on the above diagram. And 195<sup>as 3/4</sup> returned to the S. Gen<sup>l</sup> office. The whole of the Thomas Craike Survey is now owned and occupied by Peter Snyder in right of said Tho<sup>s</sup> Craike & Jn<sup>o</sup> Kerlin.
