



Situate in Buffalo township Union (late Berks) County Surveyed the 3<sup>d</sup> day of September 1833 by Virtue of an Order of Survey granted to Henry Lehr dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 871. Containing three hundred & Six Acres & 57 perches with the Usual Allowance of Six pr. Cent &c.

Note. The same being part of a tract of 925 Acres of land Surveyed the 25<sup>th</sup> day of May 1769 for Major John P. Dehaas - being the Allotment which fell to him on the Division of 8000 Acres Surveyed for the Officers of Col<sup>l</sup> T. Francis Corps in pursuance of an Order of Survey N<sup>o</sup> 1. And now Owned & Occupied by Hugh Wilson and John Lincoln in right of the Said Major J. P. Dehaas.
