



Situate in Buffalo township Union (late Berks) County. Surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> day of March 1833 by virtue of an Order granted to John Wilson dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 1773. Containing two hundred and twenty eight Acres with the Usual Allow- of Six <sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Cent.

The same tract of land was surveyed the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1769 for Thomas Lowry in pursuance of his Order dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 266. Now held by the heirs of James Jenkins Dec<sup>d</sup> in right of Thomas Lowry.
